Are solar energy companies scamming consumers?

As solar energy has boomed over the years, some companies "have preyed on consumers by offering predatory and costly loans," and many of them "are engaging in overly aggressive sales tactics or are outright scamming consumers," said CNET.

What happens if you buy a solar energy system?

The debt incurred to buy the system "elevates the risk that the consumer will lose their home to bankruptcy or foreclosure," the report cautioned. Last year, the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) published a report highlighting the major gotchas with solar energy contracts.
